Guide to Submission of Projects or Articles

Consider these questions:

- How are your designs shaping the Caribbean Region in the way spaces are experienced?
- How does your architecture and design cultivate Caribbean business culture, industry, innovation, economic development, or well-being?
- What collaborations or processes shape the outcomes of your projects?
- What types of spaces allow our people to be productive, innovative, and thrive in both mind and body?
- What does the future of Caribbean workplace culture look like by design?

The Ask

- 1 To submit a completed work with an understanding of its design evolution, process and aspirations for the development of a collaborative article written by a CAD committee member.
- OR
- 2 To submit an article on a topic of the author's choosing that aligns with the magazine's theme, tone and audience.



How to Submit

Email your project or article summary (100-150 words), including imagery, in both Word and PDF formats, to:

Your Summary Should Include:

- 1 Title & Statement**
A working title and brief description of the project/article's focus
- 2 Key Points**
3 to 5 ideas or themes that are critical to the project or article topic
- 3 Core Conclusions**
What about this project/topic speaks to the future of Caribbean architecture and design
- 4 Key Players**
Who was involved in the project (if applicable)
- 5 Reference Images**
Photos that visually support or provide context for your project or article

Technical Requirements

Guest-Authored Articles

Articles should:

- Be written in English and not exceed 750 words
- Be original (not previously published or under review elsewhere)
- Align with the magazine's tone and audience while maintaining the author's voice
- Include **3 to 5 high-resolution images**, with captions and proper permissions (where applicable)
- Credit all contributors and collaborators appropriately

Project Submissions

Project submissions must:

- Include **3 to 5 high-resolution images**, with captions and proper permissions (where applicable)
- Qualify key players willing to share insight on the project

August 21	Submission Deadline
August 31	Notification of Acceptance
October 9	Full Article & Low-Res/Sample Images Deadline
November 13	Copy Editor Feedback Provided
November 20	Hi-Res Images Due
November 27	Final Revised Articles Due

Final layouts and copy-edited drafts will be shared with authors/owners for final approval before publication.

Editorial Notes

1. **Editing:** ALL articles will undergo editorial review. Authors will be consulted on any major edits.
2. **Images:** Photos **MUST** be at least 300 dpi and captioned. Proof of ownership or permission is required for any images not owned by the Barbados Institute of Architects (BIA).
3. **Note:** ALL submissions are subject to review and approval for inclusion in the magazine by the editor.

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
